POLICY IN RESPECT OF DOGS

Conditions

Battle Bowls Club welcomes well-behaved dogs at its ground subject to the following conditions:

- Dogs must be on a short lead at all times with the lead securely held or tethered
- Long leads, if used, must be locked at the length of a short lead
- Dogs must not be allowed onto the playing surface at any time
- Dogs are not permitted to enter the clubhouse or the changing rooms
- Dogs must not exhibit aggressive or disruptive behaviour
- Owners must clean up after their dogs and take any bags away from Club premises

Assistance Dogs

Assistance dogs are defined as dogs specifically trained to assist individuals with disabilities, including guide dogs for the visually impaired, hearing dogs for the hearing impaired, and service dogs for various other disabilities.

The above conditions notwithstanding, access for assistance dogs to the clubhouse and changing rooms is permitted as required by the Equality Act 2010.

Enforcement

Owners, whether members or visitors, are responsible for the behaviour of their dogs and may be required to leave the Club's premises by a Club official if the behaviour of owner or dog is considered to have contravened the conditions above.

In the case of a member, any breach of the conditions above will be considered misuse of the Club's premises and may constitute an offence under section 3.1.13 of the Club's Disciplinary Policy.
